## Pesticide-free wild blueberries

"We're guaranteeing the consumer that there has not been any kind of chemical pesticide or herbicide or fungicide that has been put on that field for at least one year," says George Johnson of Forest Hills Farms.

All the wild blueberries sold under the Forest Hills Farms name are grown on their own lands in the Westchester and Great Villages areas on fields along the Cobequid Range.

"We don't view them as a crop that would grow on a farm," says Johnson. "We view them as a crop that would grow on the floor of the forest. And that's really different."
