

# Century-old country market in Port Greville

There aren't many century-old country stores left in Nova Scotia. The Port Greville Country Market is one of them.

Since 1893, the market has been the hub of the community, providing one-stop shopping for local residents and offering visitors a glimpse of a rural way of life.

The market, which has won two Ambassador tourism awards, features unique antiques, fine china, handmade quilts, giftware, collectables and a year-round Christmas room. All of these can be found on the second floor with an unusual rounded ceiling.

On the main floor, there is fresh baking, local seafood, beer, wine and spirits, an ice cream corner, a full range of groceries and travellers' supplies, such as ice, propane and maps, and high-speed internet access.

The market is about halfway between Parrsboro and Advocate.

Susan and Terry Benjamin took over ownership of the market from the Shaw family in early 2011.

Susan, Terry and their staff are committed to continuing a tradition of service and hospitality going back more than 100 years.
